Hi everyone, this is Nancy. Today is Mar 27th, 2021. How are you doing? Have you ever wonder, "Should I uphold the precepts? Why should I uphold precepts?"

A person told the King and the King was also curious how beautiful a woman could be, but he couldn't find a reason to take a look at her.

An official said to the King, "This couple both are Buddhists and uphold the five precepts. When they make offerings to cultivators, they would give them in person."

So the King disguised himself as a monk and he came to the lay couple's house. The wife saw a monk coming for food, she came out quickly and paid homage to him. The King looked carefully at her and saw that she was indeed a beauty. After he returned, he said to his ministers, "The woman is indeed peerless. I like her. How can I get her?"

Again, the King took a suggestion. He sent the layman to a lotus pond hundreds of miles away to pick five-colored lotus flowers. To be able to get those flowers, one had to overcome three difficulties-poisonous snakes, ghosts and gods, and evil beasts in order to reach the pond smoothly. Before this layman, there were many criminals who were sent to pick the flowers. They all died on the road and none could finish the task.

After a discussion with his wife, the man was on his road alone. He chanted the name of the Buddha in the mind and recited the ten precepts in the mouth without stopping. He met a ghost who ate humans first. The ghost asked him who he was. The man said, "I am a faithful Buddhist."
